The staff nominated Oliver to receive the award in recognition of the positive way in which he has dealt with his current medical and mobility issues. For such a young child, he is an inspiration to us all.



The First Communion Mass on Saturday was a lovely occasion. It was a privilege to be in the congregation to witness all the children receiving the Blessed Sacrament for the first time. During Monday's assembly I talked to the children about Mary; I also had the opportunity to present Oliver Richards with his trophy in front of the school community.

Wednesday morning's hymn practice was our first whole school gathering in the aftermath of the awful events in Manchester on Monday evening. Sr Jude from the Brentwood Religious Education Service had put together a prayer service that Mrs Lewins was able to use with the children as they prayed for the victims and their families.

Yesterday morning, all pupils, staff and visitors marked an impeccable national one minute's silence at 11.00am on the school playground. We used our Remembrance Cross as a focal point. I know that some families from our school community have friends and relatives in Manchester that have been affected by this recent outrage and we will keep them all in our prayers.



Miss Furby, Mr Lawrence, Mrs Gilbert and Mrs Wade accompanied a team of Reception and KS1 children to St Teresa's Catholic School in Rochford yesterday to compete in a cross-country running event—the ***Pentecost Dash***. I believe that it was a highly competitive affair, but our children were a credit to the school with their behaviour and attitude. A couple of our children came home with medals: Bradley Boateng earned silver in the Year 1 Boys' Race and Abigail Barber received bronze in the Year 2 Girls' Race. 
