On Tuesday afternoon, Year 6, accompanied by Miss Fordham and Mrs Clifton, headed to The Deanes School to attend 'Crucial Crew' This is an event in which Holy Family has always taken part because the children learn some valuable life skills. The sessions covered aspects of safety related topics including fire, water and road safety, 999 calls and stranger danger advice.

On Wednesday morning selected children from KS1 attended their Catholic Sports competition at St Teresa's Catholic Primary School. The team was not placed but everyone tried their best and that is all that we can ask of the children. Thank you to the parents who came to support the school and to the staff who accompanied the children.

On Thursday morning it was the turn of our KS2 to attend their Catholic Sports at St Thomas More High School in Westcliff. Considering the fact that we are a small one-form entry school, we finished a creditable 5<sup>th</sup> out of 8 schools—apparently we were just a few points away from being placed third overall. Several children returned to school with medals; some returned with medals and new Catholic deanery records.

Jessica, Y6 won gold in the girls' long-jump—she also set a new record. The Year 5 boys' relay team (Cailen, Joshua, Samuel and Ellis) also set a new record and won gold. Maya came 1<sup>st</sup> in the Y6 girls' sprint; Zeneida came 3<sup>rd</sup> in the javelin and the Y6 girls' relay was won by Maya, Leah, Zeneida and Elle. Joshua, Y5 received bronze in the long distance race, whilst Daragh, Y5 also won bronze for the ball throw. Cailen won an individual gold in the sprint to accompany his relay gold. Congratulations also to Dylan, Y4 for winning gold in the long jump. Well done to all the team for competing so well. Thank you to staff and parents who supported the team. We look forward to some more medals on Tuesday at the local District Sports.

Whilst the older children were out of school, the Nursery Class held their sports morning on the school field. The children competed in egg & spoon, shopping race and a running race. Thanks to everyone who came along and thank you to the Nursery staff for organising the morning.

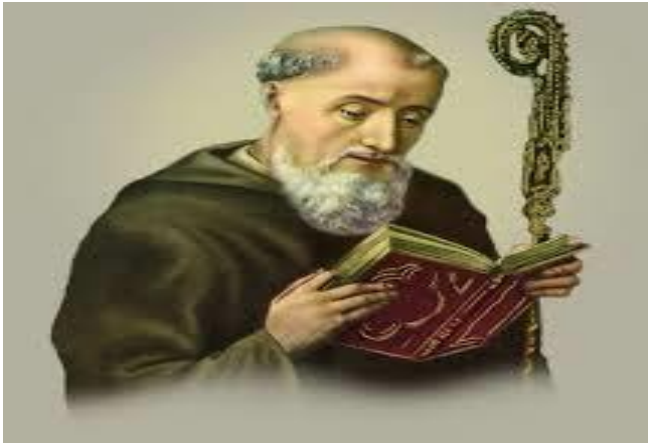
