I had the privilege of attending a conference in London last Friday organised by the Institute of Our Lady of Mercy (the Sisters of Mercy). The sisters are still extremely active in supporting education in the schools they founded (Holy Family, St Joseph's, Canvey and Our Lady of Ransom, Rayleigh are three local examples) in England and around the globe. The keynote speaker was Fr Dermot Donnelly from Newcastle (Dec's brother) who was inspirational and reminded all attendees of the vital importance of Catholic schools and mercy values. He was at his most challenging when he asked us to show love, mercy and forgiveness to those members of our school communities who frequently wrong others through their words and actions. Sometimes things will happen in school, or in life generally that we don't like or approve of, but it's our duty as Christians in a Catholic school to show mercy and forgiveness to an individual, despite any harm or hurt they may have caused us—it's certainly not easy.

Throughout this week, the children have been learning about Hinduism. Our Catholic RE Scheme of Work (**Come & See**) requires us to teach the children about Judaism each year and one other major world religion. Last year the children learned about Islam; this year is the turn of the Hindu faith. Miss Fordham our RE subject leader arranged the teaching module to coincide with the Hindu (and Sikh) festival of lights—Diwali. The highlight of the week was undoubtedly the opportunity to learn Indian dance from a professional dancer. Thank you to all parents who have sent in voluntary donations to cover Hinduism week costs—there is still time to send in a contribution if you haven't done so already. We finished with a Hinduism week assembly this afternoon. Children from each class had an opportunity to share what they have learned this week.



Donna Longcroft, the dance teacher from the Education Group who led the Bollywood dance sessions commented that she had had a lovely day due to the children's participation and the friendliness of the school.

The response to the Mad Science opportunity has been phenomenal. Lynn from the Mad Science regional office told me that Holy Family School sold out more quickly than any other school that has facilitated a Mad Science club. As so many Holy Family pupils were unable to get a place in the club and were put on a waiting list, from Tuesday 17th October, Mad Science will run two clubs in Holy Family (at the same time). All the children currently on the waiting list can attend and there is an opportunity for anyone who is not on the waiting list to register.



On Thursday, Tommy from Rock Steady held music workshops for each class throughout the day so that the children could try out various instruments.

If enough children are interested in booking lessons with Rock Steady, they have offered to come into school on Tuesday mornings to provide peripatetic lessons. I know the children were extremely engaged during their workshop sessions.
