

Saint of the week In popular culture we refer to 26th December as Boxing Day, but for centuries Christians have known it as St Stephen's Day. Stephen is honoured as the first Christian Martyr. His name means "crown" and he was the first disciple of Jesus to wear the martyr's crown.

Stephen was one of the first deacons in the early Christian Church ordained by the apostles as helpers who looked after the widows and the poor. God worked many miracles through Stephen and he spoke with such wisdom and grace that many were converted to Christianity. Stephen was dragged from the city of Jerusalem to its outskirts where he was stoned to death. He prayed to God to forgive his killers as he was dying. He is a true inspiration to us all.
