Last Friday's performance of Aladdin by the Benfleet Young Drama Group was fantastic. I would like to thank Jackie Poth and all her helpers for coming into school to set up this event. However, most praise and thanks should go the performers themselves—most of them current Holy Family pupils.

Bank Holiday Monday always seems to confuse me for the remainder of the week—the children will tell you that I kept referring to Tuesday morning's assembly as Monday morning's assembly! As May is the month of our Blessed Mother Mary, I chose Mary as the topic for my assemblies on Tuesday and on Thursday. I was extremely impressed by the number of children who went home on Tuesday and set up May Altars at home—this is a wonderful old, Catholic tradition that I remember from my childhood. Thank you to all the parents who have been busy building May Altars or moving furniture around to accommodate them.

Scarlet Fever & Slapped Cheek Syndrome A small number of children have presented symptoms that may or may not be **Scarlet Fever** or **Slapped Cheek Syndrome**. If you think that your child has either one of these conditions, please see your G.P. If one of these infections is confirmed by your doctor, please inform the ladies in the school office. The NHS Choices website has excellent information about what you can do to minimise the risk of spreading these infections as well as other advice. A **Scarlet Fever** letter and information sheet were sent out via Parentmail today; they have also been posted on the **Safeguarding** section of our school website.

RE Inspection Yesterday, Mrs Pam Brannigan a representative of the Diocese of Brentwood spent the day in school to carry out a Section 48 RE Inspection. She observed the teaching of RE in all classes; watched my whole school assembly; looked at children's work and other documents; and most importantly of all she spent time meeting with and talking to children as individuals and in groups. We expect the diocese to publish a final report in 2—3 weeks' time. Mrs Brannigan wanted me to pass on how wonderful and engaging the children are at Holy Family. She was greatly impressed by the Catholic life and ethos of the school. I am grateful to Fr Eduard and Mrs Herridge who spent the day in school as representatives of the governing body.

NFER Pilot Tests Holy Family School has a long history of working with government agencies and NFER to trial proposed new tests and assessments. Yesterday, Mrs Gillian Stimson from NFER administered two potential new SATs tests to our Year 2 children in the school hall. All of our Year 2 pupils were a credit to the school and did their very best. The insights that Holy

Family staff members gain from seeing these pilot tests is invaluable in helping to plan our curriculum and best prepare our children for future assessments.

Class Masses & Liturgies Fr Eduard met with Mrs Hurley and me on Wednesday to set dates for class Masses and other services. In the summer term, KS2 Masses will be in Holy Family Church on Thursday mornings at 10.00am (*KS2 dates to be confirmed*) Fr Eduard will also join us for Crowning of Our Lady at the end of May and will lead a procession and devotions in honour of the Blessed Sacrament for ***Corpus Christi***.

Swimming Lessons We were so pleased that, despite the rain, swimming lessons began on Wednesday and the children who took part really enjoyed themselves. There have been queries from some parents about the compulsion for children to take part in swimming lessons. Class swimming lessons have been part of the Holy Family School PE curriculum for over 40 years. The pool itself was built and paid for by fundraising in the parish community. The school governors are keen to ensure that all children have the opportunity to swim as part of the summer term PE curriculum. The refurbished pool and the brand new changing rooms are the envy of many other schools—Kents Hill Infants will once again be renting our facilities later this term. The governors understand that the £30.00 donation requested of parents (capped at £60.00 per family) is another domestic expense, but at £3.00 per lesson, with a qualified swimming teacher and additional support staff, this is extremely good value. The governors would expect that all of our children (unless there is a medical reason) participate in swimming lessons. They are grateful to the parents who have already paid their contribution. If all families contribute, then the pool and swimming lessons can continue to be offered for the collective good of all our children.

SATS Week Our Year 6 children will be sitting their SATS tests in the school hall next week. All of them have taken home a timetable of exams and an invitation to come into school and join Miss Fordham for breakfast in the hall each morning. One boy said: “It’ll be like Danbury all over again.” Our Year 2 children also undertake SATS assessments at this time of year, but do so in their own classroom.

Saint of the Week May is the month of Our Lady, the Blessed Virgin Mary. Please encourage your children to pray to Mary throughout May; perhaps they would like to use their Rosary to pray to Mary in a very special way. In hymn practice this week, the children began learning some traditional Marian hymns which they will sing this later in the month when we have our Crowning of Our Lady service.



Mgr George Stokes Earlier this week, we were notified of the death of Mgr George Stokes, the former Diocesan Director of Education. Mgr George had been a resident in the Nazareth House, Southend prior to his death, as his ill-health prevented him from fulfilling his parish duties in Grays. Mgr George was a formidable man and was a staunch defender of Catholic education throughout his working life, at local, regional and national level. Please pray for the happy repose of his soul.
