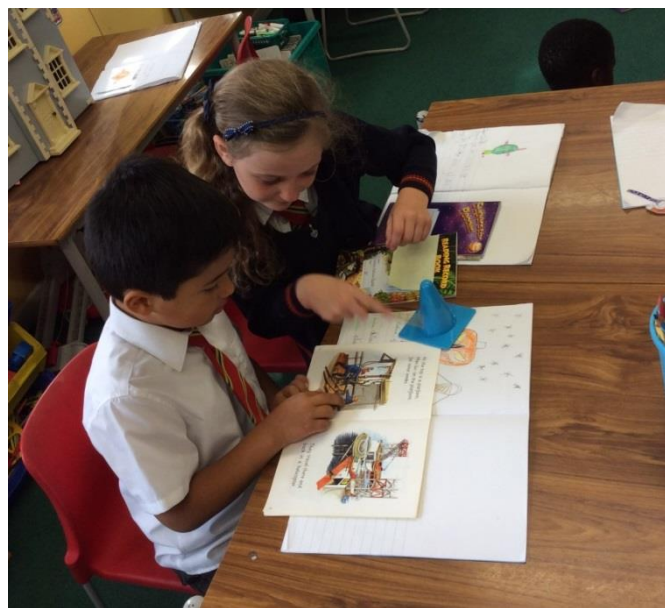

He also explained the word Halloween to the children—Hallow, he told us is an Anglo-Saxon word for holy, so the Feast of All Saints was known in England as the Feast of All Hallows. Halloween is merely the evening before the Feast of All Hallows.

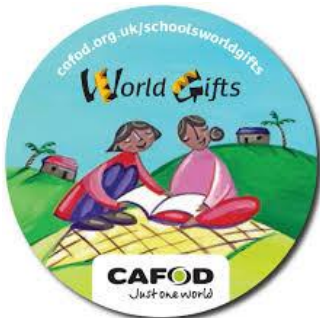

He is a saint I hold in particular affection as my parents gave me the middle name of Martin in his honour; I also had a statue of St Martin in my bedroom when I was growing up. St Martin was born in Lima, Peru during the time of Spanish rule. As he was of mixed race, many of the opportunities that were open to Peruvians of Spanish descent were not open to him. He devoted his whole life to the service of others—people and animals. He actually ran a hospital for cats and dogs at his sister’s house. He was a Dominican brother throughout his adulthood and is held in high esteem by members of that order to this day.
