The last few days in school have been varied and busy, but it's always lovely to be in school during Holy Week; the Year 4 Easter presentation was a solemn and appropriate way to end the term.

We welcomed Father Eduard in to school on Monday morning for a whole school Reconciliation Service which was a reflective, thoughtful occasion. Father then made himself available for those children in the juniors who wished to attend individual Confession. I am always proud of the maturity which our pupils display at such important times. Preparing our hearts and minds for Easter is such an important part of Lent.

Mr Corder from the Ford Technical Centre, Dunton came into Year 3 on Monday afternoon to talk to the class about robotic technology and to present the children with certificates for building great robots on Robot Factory Day. Despite no longer having children at Holy Family, we are extremely grateful to the continued support that Mr Corder and Ford provide for the school in a variety of ways.

On Tuesday afternoon, Mrs Birtles, Miss Lardner, Mrs Bewers and Mr Lawrence took a team of junior children to the annual Hot Cross Run at St Thomas More High School (photos attached). It was a very close competition and our children ran extremely well with a number coming back with medals: Ciaran Mastrogiacommo, Jessica Barber, Daragh Mastrogiacommo, and Luke Whitbourn. Overall Holy Family came fourth, narrowly missing out on third by a single point. Well done to all our runners and thank you to all the parents and family members who helped with transport and supported the squad. Later on Tuesday, there was much deliberation by the staff over the winners of this year's Eggshibition on the theme of Rio 2016 –Olympics. They agreed that the standard was very high and all the children who took part were given a small chocolate egg. The following children were awarded with a larger egg: Millie Fincham (running) RW; Jethro Fisher (boating) Y1; Bethany Webb (long jump) Y2; Freddy Fincham (boxing) Y3; Maya Meleard (running) Y4; Freddie Macal (diving) Y5; Larissa Guit (tennis) Y6. The judges selected Freya Essex's Eggshibit as the overall winner. She had created an equestrian themed model. Thank you to all the children, parents and other family members who got involved with this year's Eggshibition. Behind all the fun is an important message about the Resurrection and new life. Fr Eduard took some time to view the Eggshibits on Monday afternoon.

The week was concluded with the Easter presentation this afternoon which this year was performed by Year 4. There was a reverent and holy atmosphere in the hall during the performance and we are very proud of the children for performing with such maturity. It was lovely to see so many parents, grandparents and friends in school to watch the presentation. Thank you to Mrs Hurley, Mrs Herman and Mrs Bewers for preparing the children so well.
